

September and October Scholarships

Loran Award – Scholarships ranging from \$2000 - \$100,000 for grade 12 students with an academic average above 85%. Loran award winners are students who demonstrate character, service and leadership potential. Excellent applicants show a genuine commitment to serving others, ability to manage and lead others, determination, independent thinking and a willingness to take meaningful risks. Three students can be sponsored by the school with an application deadline of October 18. Other students can be direct pool applicants with a deadline of October 25. Horatio Alger Jim Pattison Alberta Scholarship Program – Students are eligible for this \$5,000 scholarship if they are enrolled as a full time grade 12 students with plans to enter a post-secondary institution in September, 2017. The student must have critical financial need; have a minimum grade percentage of 65%, and a strong commitment to pursuing and completing a degree at an accredited post-secondary institution in Canada. Scotiabank National Scholarship – Fifteen scholarships valued at \$5000 each are available for high school students planning to enroll in a certificate, diploma or degree program in the 2018 / 19 academic year. Deadline: November 2 Website: www.yconic.com/program/scotiabank-national-scholarship

Alberta Blue Cross Scholarship Program – Alberta Blue Cross awards 65 scholarships to Albertans entering full-time post-secondary study in Alberta. These scholarships range from \$750 to \$1,500 and awarded to students on the basis of academic achievement and financial need. University of Toronto National Book Awards – The University of Toronto National Book Award Program is intended to recognize and reward the very best Canadian grade 12 students, regardless of which university those students choose to attend. Star Scholarship – The P.E.O. Star Scholarship is worth \$2500 for graduating high school females. Applicants must be female, exhibit excellence in leadership, academics, extracurricular activities, community service, and plans to attend an accredited post-secondary institution in Canada or the United States. Fellowship for Full Time Study in French – For Alberta students taking full-time post-secondary studies taught in French in any discipline anywhere in Canada (full time is defined as being enrolled in a minimum of a 60% course load – three courses per semester in which the course content and the language of instruction are in French). Value \$500 - \$1000 per semester. Deadline: November 15. Website: www.studentaid.alberta.ca

TD Canada Trust Scholarships for Community Leadership – Twenty scholarships valued at up to \$70,000 includes: up to \$10,000 for tuition per year, \$7,500 a year toward living expenses, an offer of paid summer employment, and mentorship opportunities. Scholarships are open to grade 12 students who have demonstrated outstanding community leadership and obtain a minimum average of 75%. Deadline: November 17. Website: www.tdcanadatrust.com

House of Commons Page Program – Graduating students have the opportunity to be a House of Commons Page. Students must present an academic average of 80% and be fluent in English and French. Students must also be accepted at a university in the National Capital Region (Carleton University, University of Ottawa, Saint Paul University, or Université du Québec) Deadline: December 4. Remax Quest for Excellence – 16 bursaries of \$1000 each will be awarded to graduating students in Western Canada. Students must write a short essay to demonstrate their leadership, motivation and communication skills.
