Online Registration/Verification for 2020-2021





Online registration and verification for the 2020-2021 school year will open February 3!

This process must be completed for every student each school year. Please check your email beginning February 3 2020 for a message from "PowerSchool Registration Support" noreply@noreply.psrsupport.com and follow the instructions in that email to complete the registration process.

All parents and guardians are required to complete the registration process by 4:30pm on March 20, 2020. This deadline allows us to determine the eligibility of bus pass applicants, the routing of buses, bus pass production and data verification before the summer break while schools are still operating. Any applications received after the March 20 deadline may not be processed in time for the first day of school.

Payment arrangements for bus passes must be received through Parkland School Division's online payment system (Rycor) or at the Parkland School Division Centre for Education on or before **Friday**, **June 26**, **2020** for students to be eligible to ride the bus the first day of school. Remember: If your child does not have a valid bus pass for the 2020-2021 school year, they will not be able to ride the bus.

REACHING YOUR CHILD DURING THE SCHOOL DAY

For Grade 12 students....you have almost crossed the finish line! Make sure that your graduation requirements are going to be met. If you want to check this *one more time* look at your mypass.alberta.ca account or book an appointment to see one of us. Make sure to finish strong!

Post Secondary Updates - Students planning for post-secondary in September, 2020 should be well on their way with preparations. Students who have not yet applied for post-secondary studies should be doing so soon. Each institution has different application procedures and deadline dates. Some institutions have spring Open Houses or other opportunities to visit campus. These are a great way to become more familiar, and hence more comfortable, with your new school. Visit a counsellor if you have any questions regarding the next steps.

No clue what you are doing after graduation? That's okay too! If you need help planning for life after high school, why not visit a counsellor? - For Grad Portrait Re-take session bookings will start on February 14, 2020 with the on-line Appointment Plus program @ http://lifetouch.ca/northernalberta Grad fees must be paid prior to scheduling an appointment. If an appointment has been booked and the Grad fee remains outstanding the appointment will be cancelled. Proofs from the first photo session must be handed in at the time of re-takes or a fee for the second set will be imposed by Lifetouch. The fee is payable directly to the photographer at the time of the re-take appointment. First time portrait sessions can also be booked during Re-take Days.
- ➤ Lifetouch Graduation Re-take Photos March 2 5, 2020 held at MCHS.
- ➤ Jostens will again be in the Common Area on March 4 & 5, 2020 from 11:00 am 1:00 pm daily to assist with orders or to answer any questions.

Students are responsible for ensuring they meet the Alberta High School Diploma/KAE Certificate requirements to graduate and must be on the Grad list to participate in the Graduation Ceremony. 


