## Have you set up your MyPass Account Yet?

myPass is the self-service website for the education documentation of Alberta students. It is very important that all students set up their myPass account while in high school, but it is particularly important for Grade 12 students. This is the only way that Grade 12 students will find out their diploma exams marks.

Go to https://mypass.alberta.ca and "Sign in With an Education Account". Students require their Alberta Student Number (which can be found on PowerSchool) and a personal email address. Do not use your psdblogs account because it will be deactivated when you graduate. Please stop by Student Services if you have questions or require assistance.

Please note:

- This is not a Cap and Gown Ceremony. Graduates will proceed across the stage in their chosen Ceremony attire and be presented with a school-awarded certificate, diploma cover and souvenir cap & tassel.
- Grad 2022 will follow any existing Alberta Health Services protocols at the time of the event.
- General seating will be used at this event there are no assigned seats.

### **Ticket Sales**

Grad 2022 Tickets will be made available for purchase in two rounds of online ticket sales:

- Round 1: June 1 @ 9am to June 12 @ Midnight (limit of 8 tickets per graduate)
- Round 2: June 13 @ Noon to June 19 @ Midnight (no limit on ticket purchases)

Tickets are **\$32 each**, and <u>InviteRight</u> charges a service fee of **4.9% + \$2.78 per ticket**.

Please note:

- Everyone, except for the Graduates themselves, must purchase a ticket to attend the event.
- Children two years of age and under may attend for free; however, due to the limited number of seats available, children attending for free will not have access to an individual seat (i.e. they may sit on their parents' laps). Parents who wish to ensure their young children have their own seats may purchase tickets for them.
- All ticket sales are final no refunds.

Greetings, Parents and Guardians of the Grads of 2023.

We understand that conversations regarding Graduation 2023 are starting to happen. Normally, we wouldn't be reaching out to you until September, 2022; however, there have been a few concerns which we would like to address now.

This year, we have informed our current Grade 12 families, via email and our newsletters, that our Graduation Celebration will no longer include a dinner and dance. Over the past number of years, all three of our high schools have noticed a decline in the number of Graduates who choose to attend the dinner and dance portion of the event when compared to the growing numbers who attend the ceremony only. Increasing costs associated with these tickets and Grad, in general, have contributed to a two-tiered Graduation.

This is, of course, concerning for our schools as we always strive to provide equitable and inclusive opportunities, learning or otherwise, for ALL our students. Graduation can be no different. All three of the area high schools are committed to hosting Graduation Ceremonies which are accessible to ALL of our high school Graduates during the given school year. The Graduation Ceremonies for the Class of 2023 will be no different.

One of the other complexities we have been grappling with is the liability that our schools and divisions have been assuming with the event. We have been sponsoring an event where there is alcohol served and there are minors present. This has also been placing teachers directly in violation of their professional expectations.

For those families who are eager to continue with a large-scale dinner and dance Graduation experience, SPACHS, MCHS and SGCHS's Administrations are open to supporting each school having a Parent Committee who would organize the event, provided each school's individual Parent Committee offers access to ALL the respective school's Graduates. The support provided would be limited to sharing relevant vendor and business contact information, budgets and sending out initial communication to Grads and their families. If these committees were to proceed, our involvement would be such that we would not be assuming any of the potential liability. This, in and of itself, will limit our degree of involvement.

We look forward to working with you as we support your student's Graduation Ceremony next year. For the remainder of this year, our attention will be directed to the Grads of 2022 and their families.

In Entrepreneurship, students get to start their first business. As a result, they get to hear from several guest speakers who are entrepreneurs. They will also get to travel on a field trip to visit local entrepreneurs and a business incubator. On April 25, the students were lucky enough to have Colin Christensen speak to them about "Innovation" and how to generate ideas for a business. He spoke for about an hour. On May 9, we have a graduate of MCHS coming to speak to the class. Brendan Willey will be speaking about his experience and businesses. He started by taking Entrepreneurship at MCHS and has taken his experience and developed it further. Now he has several startups "on the go". On Friday, May 13, the students will learn about a great opportunity. Amanda Durand and Sue Clynes will be coming for an in-person visit to explain the YETI program. YETI stands for Young Entrepreneurs Training Initiative. High school students are eligible to receive \$500 to start a business and then operate it. The program runs through the summer and the kids get to learn from experts in the field to help them develop their business ideas.

Like in Entrepreneurship, Legal Studies exposes students to a variety of guest speakers, field trips, and a mock trial. On April 28, a lawyer is coming in to speak to the class about Landlord and Tenancy in Alberta. As the quarter progresses, the students will also hear from a crown prosecutor, an RCMP homicide detective, our School Resource officer, a fish and wildlife officer, and a travel agent. They will also travel to the Court of Queen's Bench in Edmonton.


