### **Reaching Your Child At School**

### **TORCH TIME**

#### IMPORTANT REMINDERS:

- Monday Torch Time is integrated into class time and therefore, Mondays will run on a full day bell schedule with dismissal continuing to be at 3:20 pm. This changes lunch time on Mondays to 11:25 am 12:25 pm.
- Tuesdays to Fridays will continue to have Torch Time scheduled from 2:45 3:20 pm and lunch will run from 11:05 am 12:05 pm.
- Students and the school are still accountable for the whereabouts of students until the end of the full school day. All students need to be signed up for a Torch Session every Tuesday to Friday through PowerSchool.
- Parents and teachers can also sign up a student for a Torch Session. Students cannot unenroll from those sessions. There is a video below explaining to parents how they can sign their child up for a session.
- If a student is in good standing (meeting the expectations of their teachers, parents, and themselves) and have all of their assignments submitted to a passing level, they may use that time for a personal interest Torch Session (Open Gym, Fitness Training, etc.) or sign up to be Off Campus With Parent Approval (must leave school grounds). Students are also encouraged to sign up for academic sessions if they wish to improve their marks.

### Indigenous Education

Here at MCHS, we are looking to improve and find new ways to support our Indigenous students. Our goal is to assist students and families in achieving success in high school while building culture and a sense of belonging.

We have classroom based programs, such as the Indigenous Based Program, where students are able to work at their own pace with the support of staff. As part of our school community, we help to support the transition of our students into highschool and into classroom based courses; as well as academic counselling and post-secondary guidance. We aim to connect with students emotionally, socially, academically and culturally.

We have a dedicated staff that are here to support all First Nations, Metis and Inuit Students. Please feel free to reach out and connect with staff, we are open to listening to and hearing your voice and stories.

Leanne Traverse is an Indigenous Graduation Coach and teacher of Indigenous Education at MCHS. Currently, she is in her 17th year of teaching. She attended the University of Alberta to complete her Education degree and is currently pursuing a Masters Degree in Educational Policy Studies with a focus on Indigenous Peoples Education.

Leanne is a Metis woman from Treaty 6 territory and has worked at MCHS since 2010 teaching English, Wellness 10 which uses Indigenous perspectives to guide the course and Aboriginal Studies.

Currently, she and Robin Boleski are working together to support students in an Indigenous Based Program that supports students in an independent and specialized environment.

So far, the program (which is still in its infancy stages) has been very successful and students are finding that it suits their needs well.

We are currently working on collaborating with a local Elder to create a name for the program using the Cree and Stoney language, so stay tuned!



### Welcome

Robin is working through his 17th year of teaching. He and his wife attended the U of S at the same time, in the early 2000's. His main area of teacher-training was in Mathematics, and his minor was Native Studies. He has taught mostly mathematics; along with Science, Law, Native Students and Accounting. He has coached hockey, basketball and cross-country.

Despite his (father's adopted) Polish last name, his ethnic background is English, Scottish, Danish, and Cree. He is a proud member of the Big River First Nation #118, a Treaty 6 Cree Nation in Saskatchewan. His Band recently opened a brand new arena, and named it after his uncle Jim Neilson, who had a lengthy and successful NHL career.



Robin is married with two young children who attend school in Parkland. His late father, Lanny, was an accomplished CFL player with the Calgary Stampeders. He prefers hockey over football; in addition to playing hockey, he spends most of my time with his family, riding his bikes and working out.

Robin is grateful to the various leaders in Parkland Schools for their vision and creativity in establishing this program. He is humbled to be a part of this journey, and is tremendously thankful to work alongside Mrs. Traverse with the ultimate goal of moving our Indigenous students on to various post-secondary opportunities.

Rhonda Harbert is an Indigenous Graduation Coach at MCHS. She worked her way towards her Education degree by starting her first year of post-secondary at Maskwacis Cultural College and graduated from the University of Alberta in 2005. This is her 18th year of teaching.

Rhonda is First Nations from Bigstone Cree Nation in Treaty 8 Territory. She grew up in Calling Lake, Alberta as the ninth child of a family of ten. She has two adult sons who both reside in Edmonton.

Rhonda is excited to be a part of the MCHS team and is looking forward to supporting Indigenous youth on their journey through high school and helping them explore post-secondary opportunities.



Men's & Women's Soccer tryouts are on April 11, 18 & 20 at Fuhr turf field in Spruce Grove.


Track & Field is also beginning on April 11 and all athletes are welcome and compete in the events they want. The more the merrier.
