Reaching Your Child At School

Please be aware that our phone lines are very busy between 2:45 and 3:30. There have been significant hold times.

To avoid this, please call in earlier in the day to advise of the absence. This will help you and the office. Thanks so much.

Please note that school fees are not visible on the PowerSchool App. Access to all information is only available through the <u>PowerSchool website</u>.

TORCH TIME

IMPORTANT REMINDERS:

- Monday Torch Time is integrated into class time and therefore, Mondays will run on a full day bell schedule with dismissal continuing to be at 3:20 pm. This changes lunch time on Mondays to 11:25 am 12:25 pm.
- Tuesdays to Fridays will continue to have Torch Time scheduled from 2:45 3:20 pm and lunch will run from 11:05 am 12:05 pm.
- Students and the school are still accountable for the whereabouts of students until the end of the full school day. All students need to be signed up for a Torch Session every Tuesday to Friday through PowerSchool.
- Parents and teachers can also sign up a student for a Torch Session. Students cannot unenroll from those sessions. There is a video below explaining to parents how they can sign their child up for a session.
- If a student is in good standing (meeting the expectations of their teachers, parents, and themselves) and have all of their assignments submitted to a passing level, they may use that time for a personal interest Torch Session (Open Gym, Fitness Training, etc.) or sign up to be Off Campus With Parent Approval. Students are also encouraged to sign up for academic sessions if they wish to improve their marks.

Registration Reminder - 2024-2025

If you haven't already done so, it's time to register for the next school year! That includes busing if you need it. Registering before the **Friday March 22nd deadline** will help us immensely in planning for next year both at our school and at the PSD Transportation department. Work is currently underway building bus routes for next year already.

Any applications received after the application deadline may not be processed in time for the first day of school. If your child does not have a valid bus pass for the 2024-2025 school year, they will not be able to ride the bus.

How do I get started?

Visit https://powerschool.psd.ca/public/ and log into your parent account. Once inside the Parent Portal:

- Select your child's name in the blue bar at the top of the screen.
- Select the RSVP icon on the left side of the screen.
- Begin reviewing all of your current Student Information we have on file, and follow the instructions on the screen to navigate through the various tabs in the form (Student Info, Address, Contacts, Medical, etc.).

I can't remember my login for the PowerSchool Parent Portal.

If you aren't able to retrieve your login credentials using the "Forgot Username or Password?" link on the sign-in page, please contact the school directly for assistance logging in to the Parent Portal.

Course Selections

For the current grade 9 students coming into MCHS for grade 10. The grade 10 counselor and administrator are visiting the feeder schools with information on how course selection works. They will bring a copy of our course selections for your child's teacher to put recommendations on at the top of the sheet for their core courses. That sheet then goes home for students and parents to review and select their additional option courses. Parents will sign off on this sheet. It then goes back to school where the student's teacher will help students enter their selected courses online. MCHS will review and approve these when we start building students timetables. Please ensure you have completed the registration at MCHS **BEFORE** the March 22, 2024 deadline.

The current grade 10 and 11 students will have their grade counselors come to their classes at the beginning of March to discuss the course selection process. Students will input their course selections after spring break and **MUST BE** registered before their course selections can be complete. More details to come.


Memorial Mania is kicking off









